

(3) The probable cause under paragraph (1) of this subsection is supported by credible evidence other than statements of the alleged stalking victim.

(P) CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTION UNDER § 684A OF THIS ARTICLE HAVE THE SAME POWERS OF ARREST FOR INDIVIDUALS ON THE PROPERTY OF A FACILITY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION AS ARE SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION FOR POLICE OFFICERS.

684A.

(A) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL DESIGNATE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS EMPLOYED IN EACH FACILITY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DIVISION TO HAVE THE POWER TO MAKE ARRESTS AS AUTHORIZED BY § 594B OF THIS ARTICLE.

(B) CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS EMPOWERED TO MAKE ARRESTS UNDER § 594B OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL MEET THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED AND SATISFACTORILY COMPLETE THE TRAINING PRESCRIBED BY THE MARYLAND POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1995.

**CHAPTER 15**

**(House Bill 141)**

AN ACT concerning

**Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program Grants – Extension of Sunset**

FOR the purpose of altering the termination date for the program of grants for certain crime prevention programs administered by the Governor’s Drug and Alcohol Prevention Commission.
