2-102. ORGANIZATION OF ADMINISTRATION.

- (A) IN GENERAL.
- (1) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ESTABLISH DIVISIONS OR SECTIONS IN THE ADMINISTRATION, ALONG THE FOLLOWING LINES OF RESPONSIBILITY:
 - (I) LIFE INSURANCE AND HEALTH INSURANCE;
 - (II) PROPERTY INSURANCE AND CASUALTY INSURANCE;
 - (III) AUDIT AND EXAMINATION;
 - (IV) INSURANCE PROFESSIONS; AND
 - (V) CONSUMER AFFAIRS.
 - (2) THE COMMISSIONER MAY:
- (I) ESTABLISH OTHER AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY IN THE ADMINISTRATION; AND
- (II) REORGANIZE OR ABOLISH AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY AS NECESSARY TO FULFILL EFFECTIVELY THE DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER.
 - (B) REPORT TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

THE COMMISSIONER SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ABOUT:

- (1) THE INITIAL ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE ADMINISTRATION; AND
 - (2) ANY SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES IN ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE.
 - (C) ORGANIZATION OF DIVISIONS.

THE ORGANIZATION OF EACH DIVISION SHALL BE ACCORDING TO FUNCTIONAL AREA AND SHALL BE DESIGNED FOR EFFICIENCY, SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC, AND EFFECTIVE REGULATION.
