(a) The Commissioner of Labor and Industry shall:

(2) Promulgate, as necessary, appropriate standards, rules, and regulations relating to:

(ii) Sanitation on railroad property as it affects the health of railroad employees, including clerical employees, enginemen, express employees, freight house employees, highway crossing watchmen, maintenance of way employees, platform employees, trainmen, and [yardmen.] YARDMEN;
