and other electronic means to include specifically the holding of hearings by video conferencing; requiring good cause for objections to the holding of hearings by certain means; clarifying the alternatives for holding hearings if certain objections are established; requiring the Office of Administrative Hearings to report certain information to certain committees of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the Administrative Procedure Act.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Government

10-211.

- (A) [If a party does not object,] IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, a hearing may be conducted by telephone, VIDEO CONFERENCING, or other electronic means.
- (B) (1) FOR GOOD CAUSE, A PARTY MAY OBJECT TO THE HOLDING OF A HEARING BY TELEPHONE, VIDEO CONFERENCING, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS.
- (2) IF A PARTY ESTABLISHES GOOD CAUSE IN OPPOSITION TO THE HOLDING OF A HEARING BY TELEPHONE OR OTHER SIMILAR AUDIO ELECTRONIC MEANS, THE HEARING SHALL BE HELD IN PERSON OR BY VIDEO CONFERENCING OR OTHER SIMILAR AUDIOVISUAL ELECTRONIC MEANS.
- (3) IF A PARTY ESTABLISHES GOOD CAUSE IN OPPOSITION TO THE HOLDING OF A HEARING BY VIDEO CONFERENCING OR OTHER SIMILAR AUDIOVISUAL ELECTRONIC MEANS, THE HEARING SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN PERSON.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Office of Administrative Hearings shall report, in accordance with § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, the following information to the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee and the House Commerce and Government Matters Committee before October 1 of each year:
- (1) The number of hearings that were conducted by telephone or video conferencing during the preceding fiscal year;
- (2) The types of cases in which hearings were conducted by telephone or video conferencing;
- (3) The number of cases in which a party objected to the holding of a hearing by telephone or video conferencing, the grounds for those objections, and the disposition of each objection;
