SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

2-207.

(a) A Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be issued:

(1) By the State Comptroller;

(2) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in the jurisdictions listed in paragraph (3) of this subsection; and

(3) Only in the following jurisdictions:

(i) Anne Arundel County;

(ii) Anne Arundel County – City of Annapolis;

(iii) Baltimore City;

(iv) Baltimore County;

(v) The thirteenth election district of Carroll County;

(vi) Cecil County;

(vii) Charles County;

(viii) Frederick County;

(ix) GARRETT COUNTY;

(x) Harford County;

[(x)] (xi) Montgomery County – City of Gaithersburg;

[(xi)] (xii) Washington County; and

[(xii)] (xiii) Worcester County.

(b) A holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license:

(1) May brew malt beverages at a single location for consumption on the restaurant premises; and

(2) Is limited to the brewing of 2,000 barrels of malt beverage each calendar year.
