SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

2-207.

- (a) A Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be issued:
 - (1) By the State Comptroller;
- (2) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in the jurisdictions listed in paragraph (3) of this subsection; and
 - (3) Only in the following jurisdictions:
 - (i) Anne Arundel County;
 - (ii) Anne Arundel County City of Annapolis;
 - (iii) Baltimore City;
 - (iv) Baltimore County;
 - (v) The thirteenth election district of Carroll County;
 - (vi) Cecil County;
 - (vii) Charles County;
 - (viii) Frederick County;
 - (ix) GARRETT COUNTY;
 - (X) Harford County;
 - [(x)] (XI) Montgomery County City of Gaithersburg;
 - [(xi)] (XII) Washington County; and
 - [(xii)] (XIII) Worcester County.
 - (b) A holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license:
- (1) May brew malt beverages at a single location for consumption on the restaurant premises; and
- (2) Is limited to the brewing of 2,000 barrels of malt beverage each calendar year.
