

**CHAPTER 207**

**(House Bill 295)**

AN ACT concerning

**Workers' Compensation – Domestic Servant – Minimum Earnings**

FOR the purpose of altering the earnings level above which a domestic servant in a private home is a covered employee with respect to the household under workers' compensation law.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article – Labor and Employment

Section 9-209

Annotated Code of Maryland

(1991 Volume and 1995 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – Labor and Employment**

9-209.

An individual who is employed as a domestic servant in a private home is a covered employee with respect to a household if the individual earns at least [~~\$250~~] ~~\$1,000~~ \$750 in cash in a calendar quarter from that household.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.

**CHAPTER 208**

**(House Bill 301)**

AN ACT concerning

**Creation of a State Debt – Baltimore City – U.S.S. Sanctuary**

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed ~~\$900,000~~ ~~\$300,000~~ \$250,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of Project Life, Inc. for certain acquisition, development, or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; requiring the grantee to grant and convey a certain easement easements or covenants to the Maryland Historical Trust; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.
