**(House Bill 1177)**

AN ACT concerning

**Unemployment Insurance – ~~Dependents' Allowances and Earnings Disregard~~**

FOR the purpose of increasing the amount of earnings that are not deductible from unemployment insurance benefits; ~~deleting the provision providing for the payment of dependents' allowances; decreasing the maximum number of dependents for which a claimant may be paid under a certain dependents' allowance;~~ providing for the effective date of the amendments application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the payment of unemployment insurance benefits.
