

DISTRIBUTION IN MARYLAND AT THE TIME OF THE FESTIVAL MAY BE SHIPPED DIRECTLY TO A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSEE BY A LICENSED NONRESIDENT DEALER.

(2) ALL INVOICES FOR PRODUCTS DELIVERED DIRECTLY TO THE FESTIVAL BY A NONRESIDENT DEALER, OR CREDITS FOR AUTHORIZED RETURNS, SHALL BE MADE THROUGH A LICENSED MARYLAND WHOLESALER.

(3) BEER OR WINE DELIVERED DIRECTLY TO A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSEE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE RETURNED DIRECTLY TO THE NONRESIDENT DEALER.

(4) WHENEVER A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE IS ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION, HOLDERS OF WHOLESALE LICENSES OR NONRESIDENT DEALER PERMITS MAY ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE HOLDER OF A SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE TO DELIVER BEER AND WINE 2 DAYS PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE, AND TO ACCEPT RETURNS 2 DAYS AFTER THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE SPECIAL FESTIVAL LICENSE.

(I) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR IMPLEMENTING THIS SECTION.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.

CHAPTER 360

(Senate Bill 45)

AN ACT concerning

Homicide – Prosecution – “Year and a Day” Rule Abolished

FOR the purpose of abolishing the common-law rule of “year and a day”; *by* allowing a prosecution for murder or manslaughter to be instituted regardless of the time elapsed between the ~~infliction of the fatal injury~~ *act or omission causing the death of the victim* and the death of the victim; ~~requiring the State to prove, by a certain standard, that the death of the victim resulted from the injury inflicted by the accused;~~ providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the prosecution of homicides.
