Senate Bill No. 269

AN ACT concerning

**Baltimore City – Alcoholic Beverages
(Local Hours and Days for Sale)**

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners, by regulation, to restrict the hours and days for the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages in a certain area of the City; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Baltimore City.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages
Section 11-301, 11-302, 11-303, and 11-305
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1994 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

11-301.

- (a) (1) The hours during which the privileges conferred by a Class A beer license may be exercised shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, on every day except Sunday.
- (2) In Montgomery County the hours shall be as provided in § 11-516(d)(1).
- (3) In Prince George's County the hours shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to 2 o'clock a.m. on the day following, except on Sunday when no sales shall be permitted after 2 o'clock a.m.
- (4) In Frederick County, on Sunday the hours of operation may be from 1 o'clock p.m. to 12 midnight.
- (5) In Washington County, the hours of sale are as provided under § 11-522 of this article.

(b) (1) The hours during which the privileges conferred by a Class B beer license may be exercised shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight.
