(e) In the performance of its functions, the Advisory Board may use the services of the staff and the facilities of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the Governor's Office of [Justice Assistance] CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION subject to the approval of the head of the respective department or agency.

## DRAFTER'S NOTE:

Pursuant to Executive Order 01.01.1995.18, the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention has assumed the duties previously assigned to several entities that were abolished by that Executive Order. A letter of advice from Assistant Attorney General Kathryn M. Rowe, dated November 17, 1995, states that the transferral of statutory duties from the former entities to the new Office is a matter of legislative intent that should be confirmed by the enactment of legislation.
