Alcoholic Beverages - Harford County (Off-Premises Pub-Brewery License Sales)

FOR the purpose of adding Harford County to those jurisdictions in which the holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may sell malt beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers; clarifying structure and language; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Harford County.

- (2) [the] THE holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may sell malt beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers.
