House Bill No. 1290

AN ACT concerning

**Alcoholic Beverages – Harford County
(Off-Premises Pub-Brewery License Sales)**

FOR the purpose of adding Harford County to those jurisdictions in which the holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may sell malt beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers; clarifying structure and language; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Harford County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages
Section 2-207(g)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(1994 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages

2-207.

(g) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN THE FOLLOWING JURISDICTIONS:

- (~~I~~) ~~{In the} City of Annapolis, Anne Arundel County[,];~~
- (I) [In the] City of Annapolis[,];
- (II) Anne Arundel County[,];
- (~~III~~) (III) Baltimore City[,];
- (~~IV~~) (IV) Baltimore County[,]; [and]
- (~~V~~) (V) Charles County[,]; AND
- (~~VI~~) (VI) HARFORD COUNTY.

(2) [the] THE holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may sell malt beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers.
