- (b) There is hereby established in the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, a Police Training Commission whose membership shall consist of the following persons:
- (1) The President of the Maryland [Chief] CHIEFS of Police Association; the President of the Maryland Sheriffs Association; the President of the Maryland Law Enforcement Officers, Inc.; the Attorney General of the State of Maryland; the Secretary of the State Police; the Commissioner, Baltimore City Police Department; the Chancellor of the University of Maryland System; the agent in charge of the Baltimore office of the F.B.I.; the President of the Eastern Shore Police Association; a representative of the Maryland State Lodge of Fraternal Order of Police; the Deputy Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services; and three police officials of the State to be appointed by the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services, with the approval of the Governor, and with the advice and consent of the Senate, to represent the State geographically, the appointments to be made for a three-year term provided that, for the first term, one official shall be appointed for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of three years.
