(a) (3) However, an adjudication of a child as delinquent by reason of his violation of the State vehicle laws, INCLUDING A VIOLATION INVOLVING AN UNLAWFUL TAKING OR UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE UNDER ARTICLE 27, § 342A OR § 349, OR § 14-102 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE shall be reported by the clerk of the court to the Motor Vehicle Administration, which shall assess points against the child under Title 16, Subtitle 4 of the Transportation Article, in the same manner and to the same effect as if the child had been convicted of the offense.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997.
