

AND (1) ON A FIRST OFFENSE, MAY CONTACT A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER;

(2) ON A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, shall immediately contact a law enforcement officer.

(e) A law enforcement officer contacted by school authorities in accordance with subsection (d) of this section:

(1) Shall immediately inquire as to the reasons the individual possesses the pager; and

(2) May arrest the violator.

(f) Any person who violates subsection (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,500, imprisonment not exceeding 6 months, or both.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1997.

**CHAPTER 482**

**(House Bill 803)**

AN ACT concerning

**Baltimore County - Nuisance Abatement and ~~Local Code Enforcement~~ - Community Associations - ~~Enforcement Authority~~ Standing to Seek Judicial Relief**

FOR the purpose of allowing ~~qualifying certain~~ community associations to bring certain actions in the circuit court ~~against qualifying for Baltimore County~~ for relief from certain nuisances, based on certain code violations, located within Baltimore County under certain circumstances; requiring certain notices to the County code enforcement agency and to certain tenants and property owners under certain circumstances; requiring the filing of a bond for certain purposes court to make certain determinations concerning a bond under certain circumstances; ~~requiring that a proceeding under this Act be expedited in certain manners~~; providing that a political subdivision may not be subject to certain actions; providing for and limiting the construction of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the right of community associations to seek judicial relief for nuisance abatement of certain nuisances in Baltimore County.
