- (a) (1) Each county shall set, by ordinance or resolution, a TOP MARGINAL county income tax RATE equal to at least [20%] 1% but not more than [60%, to be applied to the State income tax for an individual] 3% OF MARYLAND TAXABLE INCOME.
- (2) A TOP MARGINAL county income tax rate continues until the county changes the rate by ordinance or resolution.
- (3) (i) A county may not increase its county income tax rate above [50%] 2.5% until after the county has held a public hearing on the proposed act, ordinance, or resolution to increase the rate.
- (ii) The county-shall publish at least once each week-for 2 successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county:
  - 1. notice of the public-hearing; and
- 2. a fair summary of the proposed act, ordinance, or resolution to increase the county income tax rate above [50%] 2.5%.
- (4) Notwithstanding paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection, in Howard County, the county income tax rate may be changed only by ordinance and not by resolution.

## (B) THE COUNTY INCOME TAX RATE IS:

- (1) 40% OF THE TOP MARGINAL COUNTY INCOME TAX RATE FOR MARYLAND TAXABLE INCOME OF \$1 THROUGH \$1,000;
- (2) 60% OF THE TOP MARGINAL COUNTY INCOME TAX RATE FOR MARYLAND TAXABLE INCOME OF \$1,001 THROUGH \$2,000;
- (3) 80% OF THE TOP MARGINAL COUNTY INCOME TAX RATE FOR MARYLAND TAXABLE INCOME OF \$2,001 THROUGH \$3,000; AND
- (4) THE TOP MARGINAL COUNTY INCOME TAX RATE FOR MARYLAND TAXABLE INCOME IN EXCESS OF \$3,000.
- [(b)](C) Except as provided in subsection [(c)] (D) of this section, if a county changes its TOP MARGINAL county income tax rate, the county shall:
- (1) increase or decrease the rate in increments of [5 percentage points] ONE-QUARTER OF A PERCENTAGE POINT, effective on January 1 of the year that the county designates; and
- (2) give the Comptroller notice of the rate change and the effective date of the rate change on or before July 1 prior to its effective date.
- [(c)](D) A county income tax rate in excess of [50%]-2.5% at the option of the county may be a multiple of [2 percentage points] ONE TENTH OF A PERCENTAGE POINT above [50%]-2.5% instead of a multiple of [5 percentage points above 50%] ONE-OUARTER OF A PERCENTAGE POINT ABOVE 2.5%.
