AN ACT concerning

Mental Hygiene Administration - Core Service Agencies - Procedure

FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to establish certain procedures within the Mental Hygiene Administration that give certain community mental health programs the right to eertain hearings and the right to appeal certain decisions in a certain manner; requiring the Secretary to adopt certain regulations access a certain mediation process and the right to request a certain hearing under certain circumstances; and generally relating to certain procedures within the Mental Hygiene Administration.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

10-1203.

- (a) To the extent resources are available, the Secretary, after consultation with the Maryland Advisory Council on Mental Hygiene as established in Subtitle 3 of this title and federal requirements mandated under P.L. 99-660, may initiate the development of core service agencies as a mechanism for community planning, management, and financing of mental health services.
 - (b) When core service agencies are initiated, the Secretary shall:
- (1) Define the priority populations to be served by the core service agencies, with a special emphasis on the provision of services to the seriously mentally ill populations;
- (2) Define the essential mental health and associated support services to be provided under the auspices of the core service agencies;
- (3) Define the essential administrative functions to be carried out by core service agencies; and
- (4) Outline the requirements for the core service agencies' governance structure.
 - (c) To assure the continuing provision of appropriate services, the Secretary shall:
