- (c) (3) (i) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this subsection, for a copy of a medical record requested by a person in interest or any other authorized person under paragraph [(1)(ii)] (2)(II) of this subsection, a health care provider may charge a fee for copying and mailing not exceeding 50 cents for each page of the medical record.
- (4) On or after July 1, 1995, the fees charged under paragraph [(2)] (3) of this subsection may be adjusted annually for inflation in accordance with the Consumer Price Index.
- (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person or entity who is not subject to the provisions of this subsection and who obtains a medical record from a health care provider or the provider's agent may not charge a fee for any subsequent copies of that medical record that exceeds the fee authorized under paragraph [(2)(i)] (3)(I) of this subsection.
