- (c) A resident may be discharged in accordance with the regulations of the Veterans' Home Commission and applicable law.

- (a) To carry out the purposes and goals of the Veterans' Home Commission, the Commission may acquire, hold, use, improve, and convey property.
- (b) In addition to any other power under this section, to carry out the purposes or goals of the Veterans' Home Commission, the Commission:
 - (1) may accept a gift or grant; and
- (2) unless the terms of a gift or grant require otherwise, on an affirmative vote of at least 7 members of the Commission, may:
 - (i) spend the principal and income of the gift or grant; or
 - (ii) invest all or part of the principal and income in:
 - 1. general obligations of the State; or
 - 2. any other security.
- (c) (1) In addition to any other power under this section, the Veterans' Home Commission may lease any part of its property for use as a concession or other commercial purpose that is consistent with the purposes of the Commission. However, the Commission may not lease its property merely for investment purposes.
- (2) Notwithstanding any other law, unless the lease expressly provides for redemption by the tenant, the lease is not subject to redemption.
