(ii) 1 shall be appointed from the State at large; and

(III) 1 SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF A WOMEN VETERANS ORGANIZATION IN THE STATE; AND

(iii) (IV) 1 shall be appointed from a list of individuals submitted to the Governor by each of the following organizations:

- 1. the American Ex-Prisoners of War, Inc.;
- the American Legion;
- the Amvets;
- 4. the Catholic War Veterans;
- 5. the Disabled American Veterans;
- 6. the Fleet Reserve Association:
- 7. the Jewish War Veterans:
- 8. the Marine Corps League:
- 9. the Maryland Retired Officers Association;
- 10. the Military Order of the Purple Heart;
- 11. the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association;

12. the [Polish-American War Veterans] POLISH LEGION OF AMERICAN VETERANS;

- 13. the Veterans of Foreign Wars;
- 14. the Veterans of World War I;
- 15. the Vietnam Veterans of America; and
- 16. the Korean War Veterans Association, Inc.; AND
- 17. THE BLACK VETERANS OF ALL WARS, INC.
- (b) Each member must be a resident of the State and a veteran whose final separation from active service with a uniformed service of the United States was under honorable conditions.
 - (c) (1) The term of an appointed member is 7 years.
- (2) The terms of the appointed members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Commission on October 1, 1984.
- (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
