hearing screening of newborns available on and after July 1, 2000, notwithstanding any policy or benefit statement to the contrary.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1999.

## CHAPTER 128

(House Bill 884)

AN ACT concerning

## Universal Newborn Hearing Screening

FOR the purpose of altering the Program for Hearing-Impaired Infants to include a certain universal newborn hearing screening component; altering the composition and responsibilities of the Advisory Council for the Program; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop methods to contact certain persons regarding the results of certain screenings; requiring hospitals to provide certain information to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in a certain manner; requiring certain carriers to provide coverage for certain screenings provided by a hospital before discharge; requiring certain hospitals to establish a certain type of program; including certain screenings in the minimum package of child wellness services; defining a certain term; altering a certain definition; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act on and after a certain date; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to universal newborn hearing screening.
