- (C) (1) "EXCESSIVE FORCE" MEANS THE USE OF GREATER PHYSICAL FORCE THAN REASONABLY NECESSARY TO REPEL AN ATTACKER OR TERMINATE RESISTANCE.
- (2) <u>"EXCESSIVE FORCE" DOES NOT INCLUDE FORCE THAT IS</u>
 REASONABLY NECESSARY TO EFFECT A LAWFUL PURPOSE.
- (D) "HARASSMENT" MEANS REPEATED, UNWARRANTED VERBAL OR PHYSICAL ANNOYANCES, THREATS, OR DEMANDS.

- (A) THE CIVILIAN REVIEW BOARD OF BALTIMORE CITY IS ESTABLISHED TO PROVIDE A PERMANENT, STATUTORY AGENCY IN BALTIMORE CITY THROUGH WHICH:
- (1) COMPLAINTS LODGED BY MEMBERS OF THE CENERAL PUBLIC RECARDING ABUSIVE LANGUAGE, HARASSMENT, OR EXCESSIVE FORCE BY POLICE PERSONNEL OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE PROCESSED AND EVALUATED; AND
 - (2) DEPARTMENT POLICIES MAY BE REVIEWED.
- (B) JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD SHALL EXTEND ONLY TO COMPLAINTS ACAINST POLICE PERSONNEL WITH RESPECT TO ABUSIVE LANGUAGE, HARASSMENT, AND USE OF EXCESSIVE FORCE AS DEFINED IN § 16-41 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND BY DEPARTMENT RULES AND RECULATIONS.

- (A) (1) THE CIVILIAN REVIEW BOARD IS COMPOSED OF:
- (I) ONE MEMBER OF THE CENERAL PUBLIC FROM EACH OF THE NINE POLICE DISTRICTS IN BALTIMORE CITY SELECTED BY THE MAYOR, SUBJECT TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL;
 - (II) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE;
 - (HI) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE VANCUARD JUSTICE SOCIETY;

AND

- (IV) THE COMMISSIONER, OR THE COMMISSIONER'S DESIGNEE.
- (2) EACH MEMBER OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC SHALL:
 - (I) BE A VOTING MEMBER OF THE BOARD; BUT
- (II) MAY NOT BE A CURRENT EMPLOYEE OF A MUNICIPAL, COUNTY, STATE, OR FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACENCY.
- (3) EACH VOTING MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE A RESIDENT OF BALTIMORE CITY.
- (B) AT ITS FIRST MEETING EACH YEAR THE BOARD SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY.
