- (1) within 5 years after the date of referral if the investigation under § 5-706 of this subtitle concludes that the report is unsubstantiated, and no further reports of abuse or neglect are received during the 5 years; and
- (2) within 120 days after the date of referral if the report is ruled out, and no further reports of abuse or neglect are received during the 120 days. 45-714.
- (a) The Social Services Administration and each local department may maintain a central registry of cases reported under this subtitle.
- (b) The respective local departments throughout this State shall provide the information for the  $\underline{A}$  central registry.
  - (c) The information in the  $\underline{A}$  central registry shall be at the disposal of:
    - (1) the protective services staff of the Social Services Administration;
- (2) the protective services staffs of local departments who are investigating a report of suspected abuse or neglect; and
- (3) law enforcement personnel who are investigating a report of suspected abuse or neglect.  $\cline{1}$
- (2) A CENTRAL REGISTRY MAY NOT CONTAIN IDENTIFYING INFORMATION RELATED TO AN INVESTIGATION OF ABUSE OR NEGLECT IF:
  - (I) ABUSE OR NEGLECT HAS BEEN RULED OUT; OR
- (II) THE ABUSE OR NEGLECT FINDING HAS BEEN EXPUNGED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 5–707(B)(1) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- (E) (1) THE DEPARTMENT OR A LOCAL DEPARTMENT MAY IDENTIFY AN INDIVIDUAL AS RESPONSIBLE FOR ABUSE OR NEGLECT IN A CENTRAL REGISTRY ONLY IF THE INDIVIDUAL.
- (I) HAS BEEN FOUND GUILTY OF ANY CRIMINAL CHARGE ARISING OUT OF THE ALLEGED ABUSE OR NEGLECT; OR
- $\underline{\rm (II)}$   $\underline{\rm HAS}$  BEEN FOUND RESPONSIBLE FOR INDICATED ABUSE OR NEGLECT AND HAS:
- ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED UNDER § 5–706.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR
