Code of Maryland; contrary to the form of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided and against the peace, government, and dignity of the State."}

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Any person or persons, his or their aiders or abettors who shall enter, or being upon the premises of any other person, body corporate or politic in the State, shall, against the will-and consent of said-person or persons, body corporate or politic or their agents, take and carry away any horse, mare, colt, gelding, mule, ass, sheen, hog, ox or cow, or any carriage, wagon, buggy, eart, boat, craft, vessel, or any other vehicle including motor vehicle as defined in the laws of this State relating to such, or property whatsoever, or take and carry away out of the custody or use of any person or persons, body corporate or politic, or his or their agents, any of the above-enumerated property at whatsoever-place the same may be found, shall upon conviction thereof in any of the courts of this State having criminal jurisdiction be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall restore the property so taken and carried away, or, if unable so to do, shall pay to the owner or owners the full value thereof. and be fined not [less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars,] MORE THAN \$5,000 or be imprisoned [in-the county or city jail, or the house of correction,] for not [less than six months nor-more than four] MORE THAN 5 years, or be both fined and imprisoned as aforesaid, in the discretion of the court, although it may appear from the evidence that such person or persons, his or their aiders and abettors, took and carried away the property or any portion of the same enumerated in this section. for his or their present use, and not with the intent of appropriating or converting the same.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 344(e) and (d), respectively, of Article 27 — Crimes and Punishments of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 344(b) and (e), respectively.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1999.

CHAPTER 349

(Senate Bill 387)

AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicle Administration - Privacy Protection Act of 1999

FOR the purpose of prohibiting the disclosure, except under certain circumstances, of Motor Vehicle Administration records containing certain personal information unless the individual who is the subject of the record consents to the disclosure in writing; authorizing a person in interest to withdraw consent to the disclosure of certain personal information; providing that a certain withdrawal of consent take effect at a certain time; making a stylistic change; authorizing
