- (15) Refuses, withholds from, denies, or discriminates against an individual with regard to the provision of professional services for which the licensee is licensed and qualified to render because the individual is HIV positive; [or]
- (16) Except in an emergency life-threatening situation where it is not feasible or practicable, fails to comply with the Centers for Disease Control's guidelines on universal precautions; OR
 - (17) FAILS TO COMPLY WITH ANY BOARD ORDER.

- (a) If after a hearing under § 4-318 of this subtitle the Board finds that there are grounds under § 4-315 of this subtitle to suspend or revoke a general license to practice dentistry, a limited license to practice dentistry, or a teacher's license to practice dentistry, or to reprime a licensed dentist, the Board may impose a penalty not exceeding [\$5,000]\$50,000:
 - (1) Instead of suspending the license; or
- (2) In addition to suspending or revoking the license or reprimanding the licensee.
