CHAPTER 384

(Senate Bill 744)

AN ACT concerning

Education - Maryland Meals for Achievement Pilot <u>In-Classroom</u> In-Classroom Breakfast Program

FOR the purpose of establishing a pilot program for <u>certain</u> schools to provide a school breakfast for all students who attend the school, regardless of the economic status of the students; requiring the State Department of Education, the county boards of education or sponsoring agencies, and schools that wish to participate in the pilot program to perform certain duties; setting a threshold level-of income for participation in certain schools; authorizing certain business entities to receive a State income tax credit for certain contributions made to a school under the pilot program; requiring the State Comptroller and the State Department of Education to adopt certain regulations; providing a termination date for this Act; <u>defining a certain term;</u> and generally relating to school breakfast programs in the State.
