FOR the purpose of prohibiting the use or possession of methyl methacrylate liquid monomer in beauty salons in the State; authorizing an inspector to take certain actions; establishing certain penalties; authorizing the State Board of Cosmetologists to suspend or revoke a license or permit under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to immediately reinstate a suspended license or permit under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board to reinstate a suspended license or permit under certain circumstances; and generally relating to a prohibition of the use or possession of methyl methacrylate liquid monomer.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) Except as otherwise provided in § 10-226 of the State Government Article, before the Board takes any final action under § 5-314 OR § 5-680.1 of this [subtitle] TITLE, it shall give the individual against whom the action is contemplated an opportunity for a hearing before the Board.

## 5-523.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in § 10-226 of the State Government Article, before the Board takes any final action under [§ 5-522 or § 5-509] § 5-509, § 5-522, OR § 5-680.1 of this [subtitle] TITLE, it shall give the person against whom the action is contemplated an opportunity for a hearing before the Board.

- (A) A PERSON MAY NOT USE OR POSSESS METHYL METHACRYLATE LIQUID MONOMER (MMA) IN A BEAUTY SALON IN THIS STATE.
- (B) TO DETERMINE WHETHER A PERSON IS IN VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, AN INSPECTOR MAY CHEMICALLY TEST PRODUCTS OR TAKE SAMPLES OF PRODUCTS AT RANDOM OR WHEN THE INSPECTOR SUSPECTS THAT A PRODUCT IS ILLEGAL.
