SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

4-1014.1.

- (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO THE WATERS OF THE STATE THAT LIE CONTIGUOUS TO ST. MARY'S COUNTY IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY.
- (B) A PERSON MAY NOT CATCH OYSTERS IN AN OYSTER SANCTUARY THAT WAS ESTABLISHED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Natural Resources shall conduct a study of the impact of power dredging and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, report to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 2004.
- SECTION 2. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1 and 3 of this Act shall take effect June 1, 1999 and shall remain effective for a period of 5 years. At the end of May 31, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Sections 1 and 3 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- <u>SECTION 5.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of the termination provision specified in Section 4 of this Act.
- SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions of Section 5 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 1999.

(House Bill 1036)

AN ACT concerning

Legal Officials – Anne Arundel County Assistant State's Attorneys – Sharing Full-Time Position

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Anne Arundel County State's Attorney to designate two or more assistant State's Attorneys to share one or more full time positions; providing for the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to the authority of the Anne Arundel County State's Attorney to designate the sharing of a full-time assistant State's Attorney position.
