- (iii) If necessary to fill the four appointments allowed to the President under this paragraph, one additional individual;
 - (2) Four individuals appointed by the Speaker of the House, including:
 - (i) At least two members of the House of Delegates;
 - (ii) At least one regulated lobbyist; and
- (iii) If necessary to fill the four appointments allowed to the Speaker under this paragraph, one additional individual; and
 - (3) Five individuals appointed by the Governor, including:
 - (i) At least one member of the State Ethics Commission;
 - (ii) At least one regulated lobbyist;
 - (iii) At least one representative of Common Cause/Maryland; and
 - (iv) and
- (iii) If necessary to fill the five appointments allowed to the Governor under this paragraph, one or two two or three additional individuals.
- (c) The chairman of the Study Commission shall be designated jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.
- (d) The Department of Legislative Services and the State Ethics Commission shall provide staff for the Study Commission.
 - (e) The Study Commission shall:
- (1) Examine the Maryland Public Ethics Law as it relates to regulated lobbyists;
- (2) Collect information about lobbying practices and standards of ethics for <u>regulated</u> lobbyists, including provisions of law relating to the regulation of lobbyists enacted by other jurisdictions;
 - (3) Receive testimony, as the Commission considers appropriate;
 - (4) Formulate a Code of Ethics for Lobbyists;
- (5) Consider whether the offices of the State Ethics Commission should be moved to Annapolis;
- (6) Propose any appropriate statutory changes to the Maryland Public Ethics Law pertaining to regulated lobbyists; and
- (7) (6) Report its findings to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly not later than December 31, 1999.
