where the land lies, or is recorded and indexed on the tax rolls of the subdivision, AND THE LIEN WILL BE SUBORDINATE TO ALL OTHER LIENS OF EVERY KIND PERFECTED AGAINST THE REAL PROPERTY PRIOR TO THE ATTACHMENT OF THE LIEN. Any subdivision, in lieu of recording in the appropriate court, may use a lien reporting system, and any subdivision so doing shall provide, on request, a lien report or memorandum with respect to any particular person.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1999 and shall apply to all liens for unpaid taxes on personal property in existence on or after July 1, 1999.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 534.

This bill requires the Caroline County Board of Education, upon request by the county commissioners, to provide with its annual budget the program implications of recommendations for reductions to or increases in its annual budget.

House Bill 597, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1999, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 534.
