(II) USED PRIMARILY FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION:

AND

(III) NOT USED PRIMARILY FOR REVENUE OR INCOME-PRODUCING PURPOSES.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not be construed as a finding or conclusion of the General Assembly regarding the merit of any claim for exemption from property tax under § 7-202 of the Tax - Property Article.

SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1999.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 770.

This bill alters the process for the condemnation of abandoned real property in Baltimore City and also adds condemnation proceedings for property valued at \$25,000 or less to the District Court's exclusive original jurisdiction.

House Bill 1181, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1999, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 770.

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City - Condemnation - Immediate Possession and Title

FOR the purpose of clarifying certain provisions concerning the immediate possession of and vesting of title to property condemned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore under certain circumstances; repealing certain obsolete provisions concerning certain condemnation powers of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore; authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to file a petition in the District Court for the condemnation and immediate possession of and title to abandoned property under certain circumstances; requiring the City to deposit with the District Court a certain sum under certain circumstances;
