State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Agriculture

2-316.

The provisions of this subtitle creating the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners and relating to the regulation of veterinarians and any regulations promulgated under this subtitle are of no effect and may not be enforced after [July 1, 2001] JULY 1, 2011.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1999.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 473.

This bill creates two new District Court judgeships - one in Prince George's County and one in Frederick County.
