SUBTITLE 4. CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

10-401. "COMMITTEE" DEFINED.

IN THIS SUBTITLE, "COMMITTEE" MEANS A CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 41, § 4-1101(c).

In this section, the reference to "a citizens' advisory committee" is substituted for the former reference to "the citizens' advisory committees" for clarity and in light of Art. 1, § 8, which provides that "[t]he singular always includes the plural, and vice versa, except where such construction would be unreasonable".

REVISOR'S NOTE TO SECTION:

Former Art. 41, § 4-1101(a) is deleted as unnecessary because the revision of this subtitle has only one definition.

10-402. ESTABLISHED.

THERE IS A CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES LOCATED IN OR PLANNED FOR LOCATION IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- (1) BALTIMORE CITY;
- (2) CUMBERLAND;
- (3) HAGERSTOWN;
- (4) JESSUP; AND
- (5) SOMERSET COUNTY.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 41, § 4-1102(a).

In the introductory language of this section, the reference to "each of the following areas" is new language added to clarify that this section creates one committee for each of the listed areas.

In item (1) of this section, the reference to Baltimore "City" is added to state expressly that which was only implied in the former reference to "Baltimore".
