WHEREAS, Early detection is associated with longer survival; and

WHEREAS, Tobacco use is implicated in 75% of all oral cancers in the United States; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

18-305.

- (A) THE OFFICE OF ORAL HEALTH SHALL ESTABLISH AN AFRICAN AMERICAN ORAL CANCER INITIATIVE TO PROMOTE SCREENING, EARLY DIAGNOSIS, AND TREATMENT OF ORAL CANCER IN AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN.
- (B) UNDER THE INITIATIVE, THE OFFICE OF ORAL HEALTH, IN CONSULTATION WITH DENTAL PROVIDERS SERVING AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN, SHALL:
- (1) INVESTIGATE THE PREVALENCE OF ORAL CANCER AMONG AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN AND IDENTIFY RISK FACTORS THAT MAY EXPLAIN THE CORRELATION:
- (2) DEVELOP EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGNS AND OTHER STRATEGIES TO PREVENT THE DISEASE AND REDUCE THE RISK FACTORS AMONG AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN;
- (2) EXPAND MEDICAL COVERAGE AND ACCESSIBILITY OF ORAL CANCER SCREENING AND EARLY DETECTION METHODS FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN;
- (4) INCREASE ACCESS OF AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN TO ORAL CANCER TREATMENT; AND
- (5) ENCAGE IN OTHER ACTIVITIES THAT REDUCE THE INCIDENCE AND IMPACT OF ORAL CANCER AMONG AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN.
- (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL OBTAIN FUNDING FOR THE INITIATIVE FROM THE GIGARETTE RESTITUTION FUND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 7-317(F)(1)(VIII) OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

SUBTITLE 8. ORAL HEALTH PROGRAM.

18-801.

THE SECRETARY SHALL ESTABLISH AND PROMOTE THE ORAL HEALTH PROGRAM TO PREVENT AND DETECT ORAL CANCER IN THE STATE, WITH A PRIMARY FOCUS OF MEETING THE NEEDS OF HIGH-RISK UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS, WITH THE INTENT TO REDUCE ORAL CANCER MORTALITY.
