SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

16-113.

(e) (1) In addition to the other restrictions provided under this subtitle, the Administration may issue:

(I) [a] A driver's license that is valid only in the State of Maryland to an applicant who has been suspended in another jurisdiction as a result of failing to comply with the financial responsibility requirements of that jurisdiction[.]; OR

(II) A TEMPORARY DRIVER'S LICENSE THAT IS VALID ONLY IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND TO AN APPLICANT FOR REINSTATEMENT OF A SUSPENDED OR REVOKED DRIVER'S LICENSE OR FOR RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE, OR A DUPLICATE OR CORRECTED DRIVER'S LICENSE IF, AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION:

1. THE APPLICANT'S PRIVILEGE TO DRIVE IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION IS REVOKED OR SUSPENDED AS A RESULT OF FAILING TO COMPLY WITH THE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS OF THAT JURISDICTION FOR WHICH A COMPARABLE VIOLATION IN THIS STATE WOULD NOT HAVE RESULTED IN REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION;

2. THE INITIAL VIOLATION THAT LED TO THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION DID NOT OCCUR WITHIN THE PRECEDING 5 YEARS;

3. THE APPLICANT IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO BE LICENSED IN THIS STATE; AND

~~3.~~ 4. THE ADMINISTRATION DETERMINES THAT THE APPLICANT WILL BE ABLE TO TAKE ANY ACTIONS REQUIRED BY THE OTHER JURISDICTION FOR REINSTATEMENT OF THE PRIVILEGE TO DRIVE IN THAT JURISDICTION.

(2) A TEMPORARY LICENSE ISSUED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE VALID FOR 90 DAYS.
