- (4) An occupational therapist who is authorized to practice occupational therapy in any other [state] JURISDICTION, if the occupational therapist[:
- (i) Practices] PRACTICES occupational therapy in this State for [not more than 90 days in any calendar year; and
- (ii) Practices occupational therapy in this State only in association with a licensed occupational therapist and notifies the Board before practicing occupational therapy in this State] THE PURPOSE OF EDUCATING, CONSULTING, AND TRAINING, FOR THE DURATION OF THE PURPOSE, AS PREAPPROVED BY THE BOARD; or
- (5) An occupational therapy assistant who is authorized to practice limited occupational therapy in any other [state] JURISDICTION, if the occupational therapy assistant[:
- (i) Practices] PRACTICES limited occupational therapy in this State for [not more than 90 days in any calendar year;
- (ii) Notifies the Board before practicing limited occupational therapy in this State; and
- (iii) Practices limited occupational therapy in this State only under the supervision of a licensed occupational therapist THE PURPOSE OF EDUCATING, CONSULTING, AND TRAINING, FOR THE DURATION OF THE PURPOSE, AS PREAPPROVED BY THE BOARD.

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
 - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
 - (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.
- (d) An applicant for an occupational therapist license shall have [completed] successfully:
- (1) [The academic requirements of] GRADUATED FROM an educational program in occupational therapy that[:
- (i) Is IS recognized by the Board and accredited by [the American Occupational Therapy Association] ACOTE or ANY other nationally recognized programmatic accrediting agency; and
