- (29) Has acted in a manner inconsistent with the health or safety of a person under the certified nursing assistant's care; [or]
- (30) Performs activities that exceed the education and training of the certified nursing assistant; OR
- (31) IS EXPELLED FROM THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO § 8–208 OF THIS TITLE FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS OF THE PROGRAM.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2000.
