CHAPTER 483

(House Bill 1414)

AN ACT concerning

Correctional Services - Juvenile Justice

FOR the purpose of ~~authorizing the Secretary of Juvenile Justice to designate certain employees of the State and private vendors to meet the training requirements of~~ authorizing requiring the Correctional Training Commission to develop and implement a certain program design and a certain course curriculum and training for certain employees of the Department of Juvenile Justice and certain employees of nonprofit and for-profit entities under contract with the Department under certain circumstances; providing that the Secretary of Juvenile Justice may establish eligibility requirements for certain employees stating a certain finding of the General Assembly; altering the membership and appointment of certain members of the Correctional Training Commission; requiring the Commission to elect annually a chairperson; altering the appointment of certain employees of the Commission; requiring the Commission to establish certain qualifications for certain appointment as a certain employee; altering a certain definition; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Department of Juvenile Justice and the Correctional Training Commission.
