- (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2002, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.
- (6) No portion of the proceeds of the loan or any of the matching funds may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in connection with the design, acquisition, or construction of any building used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, the grantee shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds have been or are being used for a purpose prohibited by this Act.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2000.

## CHAPTER 600

(House Bill 427)

AN ACT concerning

## Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages - Cultural Arts Center License

FOR the purpose of establishing in Frederick County a certain beer and wine license for the Cultural Arts Center of Frederick County; requiring that the Board of License Commissioners of Frederick County issue a certain license on approval by the Board; specifying an annual license fee; authorizing the licensee to store for sale and sell beer and wine to the public; specifying the times in which the beer and wine may shall be consumed; requiring that certain officers of Maryland Ensemble Theatre sign the application for the license; and generally relating to a beer and wine license for the Cultural Arts Center of Frederick County.
