(A) THERE IS A CANCER PREVENTION, IDENTIFICATION EDUCATION, SCREENING, AND TREATMENT PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.

(B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO COORDINATE THE STATE'S USE OF THE CIGARETTE RESTITUTION FUND TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATING TO CANCER PREVENTION, IDENTIFICATION EDUCATION, SCREENING, AND TREATMENT SO AS TO CREATE A LASTING LEGACY OF PUBLIC HEALTH INITIATIVES THAT REDUCE CANCER MORTALITY AND MORBIDITY RATES FOR CANCER AND TOBACCO-RELATED DISEASES IN THE STATE AND OTHERWISE BENEFIT THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE STATE'S RESIDENTS.

(C) THE PROGRAM CONSISTS OF:

- (1) A SURVEILLANCE AND EVALUATION COMPONENT;
- (2) A STATEWIDE PUBLIC HEALTH COMPONENT;
- (3) A LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH COMPONENT;
- (4) A MEDICAL INSTITUTION STATEWIDE ACADEMIC HEALTH CENTER COMPONENT; AND
- (5) AN ADMINISTRATIVE COMPONENT.

(D) TO INITIATE THE PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL IDENTIFY THE TYPES OF CANCERS THAT WILL BE TARGETED UNDER THE PROGRAM.

(E) (1) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET WITH MONEY FROM THE CIGARETTE RESTITUTION FUND.

(2) THE LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR IS AUTHORIZED TO AUDIT THE APPROPRIATIONS AND EXPENDITURES MADE FOR THE PURPOSES OF PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING THE USE OF ANY FUNDS BY PERSONS RECEIVING FUNDS UNDER THIS SUBTITLE UNDER A GRANT OR CONTRACT RECEIVED BY A PERSON UNDER ANY COMPONENT OF THE PROGRAM.

(F) (1) THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL SHALL SPECIFY THE AMOUNT OF FUNDING THAT IS ALLOCATED TO EACH COMPONENT OF THE PROGRAM.

(2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, MONEY THAT IS ALLOCATED TO A COMPONENT OF THE PROGRAM IN THE STATE BUDGET:

(I) MAY ONLY BE EXPENDED FOR THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH IT IS APPROPRIATED; AND

(II) MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO ANY OTHER COMPONENT IN THE PROGRAM, ANY OTHER PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT, OR ANY UNIT OF STATE GOVERNMENT, ~~UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY THE STATE BUDGET AS ENACTED.~~

(3) (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE DEPARTMENT MAY TRANSFER A MAXIMUM OF 10% OF THE TOTAL
