- (2) One member who is a representative of the Maryland Commission on African American History and Culture, selected by the Chairman of the Commission;
- (3) One member who is a representative of the Charles County Planning Commission, selected by the Chairman of the Commission; ~~and~~
- (4) Four members who are citizens from Charles County who have demonstrated an interest in establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial ~~to be~~, selected by the members of the State Senate and House of Delegates who represent any part of Charles County; and ~~be it further~~
- (5) One member of the Matthew Henson Family, selected by the members of the State Senate and House of Delegates who represent any part of Charles County; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force study:

- (1) An appropriate memorial to commemorate the achievements of Matthew Henson;
- (2) An appropriate site, within the vicinity of the birthplace of Matthew Henson, for the Matthew Henson Memorial; and
- (3) The costs associated with establishing a Matthew Henson Memorial; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by December 31, 2000; and be it further;

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland; the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
