

(I) DEVELOP PILOT MODELS FOR THE DEPLOYMENT OF INTERNET-BASED APPLICATIONS FOR GOVERNMENT AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, SUCH AS PROCUREMENT, FINANCIAL, AND HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT APPLICATIONS;

(II) PARTICIPATE IN COLLABORATIONS TO PROMOTE THE DEVELOPMENT AND TESTING OF ASP TECHNOLOGIES IN MARYLAND;

(III) PROVIDE ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE TO SMALL START-UP COMPANIES WISHING TO UTILIZE ASP TECHNOLOGIES; AND

(IV) WORK WITH INDUSTRY AND PUBLIC AGENCIES TO RESEARCH AND DEVELOP EMERGING E-COMMERCE TECHNOLOGIES.

(C) (1) THERE IS A MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE ~~OF~~ FOR THE CONSORTIUM.

(2) THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR APPROVING THE ACTIVITIES OF THE CONSORTIUM AND PROVIDING DIRECTION AND OVERSIGHT.

(3) THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE SHALL BE COMPOSED OF:

(I) THE CHIEF OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ~~OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND~~ IN THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT;

(II) THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK;

(III) THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT CENTER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK;

(IV) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND SCIENCE, ENGINEERING, AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION; AND

(V) A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR.

(b) There is an Information Technology Investment Fund.

(1) Subject to the provisions of subsection [(m)] (N) of this section and except for the cost incurred in administering the Fund, the Fund may be used for:

(1) educationally related information technology projects; [and]

(2) State information technology projects, including:

(i) pilots;

(ii) prototypes;

(iii) kiosk systems;

(iv) graphical user interface for citizen access to governmental services;
