House Bill No. 106

AN ACT concerning

State Personnel - Organ Donation Leave

FOR the purpose of providing that certain State employees may be entitled to organ donation leave with pay; establishing the maximum number of days of organ donation leave that an employee may use to serve as a bone marrow donor and an organ donor; providing that an employee may use organ donation leave only after obtaining approval from the employee's appointing authority; requiring the Secretary of Budget and Management to adopt certain regulations; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to organ donation leave for State employees.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Personnel and Pensions

9-1106.

- (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO ALL EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING TEMPORARY EMPLOYEES, OF ALL UNITS IN THE EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL, AND LEGISLATIVE BRANCHES OF STATE GOVERNMENT, INCLUDING ANY UNIT WITH AN INDEPENDENT PERSONNEL SYSTEM.
- (B) ON REQUEST, AN EMPLOYEE SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION MAY BE ENTITLED TO ORGAN DONATION LEAVE WITH PAY.
 - (C) (1) AN EMPLOYEE MAY USE:
- (I) UP TO 7 DAYS OF ORGAN DONATION LEAVE IN ANY 12–MONTH PERIOD TO SERVE AS A BONE MARROW DONOR; AND
- (II) UP TO 30 DAYS OF ORGAN DONATION LEAVE IN ANY 12–MONTH PERIOD TO SERVE AS AN ORGAN DONOR.
- (2) AN EMPLOYEE MAY USE ORGAN DONATION LEAVE ONLY AFTER OBTAINING APPROVAL FROM THE EMPLOYEE'S APPOINTING AUTHORITY.
- (D) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING ORGAN DONATION LEAVE, INCLUDING REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH CONDITIONS AND
