- (a) (1) The Montgomery County Council shall levy a direct ad valorem tax on all property assessed for tax purposes within Montgomery County and municipalities in the county. With the exception of the City of Takoma Park, the ad valorem tax shall not exceed [1 cent] 0.4 CENTS per \$100 of assessed valuation OF REAL PROPERTY OR 1 CENT PER \$100 OF ASSESSED VALUATION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY AND OPERATING REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN § 8-109(C) OF THE TAX PROPERTY ARTICLE. This tax shall be in an amount necessary to pay the sums required for the maintenance of:
- (i) Storm drainage systems in that portion of the sanitary district in Montgomery County and previously maintained by the WSSC; and
- (ii) On application of a municipality, those storm drainage systems previously maintained by the municipality.
- (2) (i) If any municipality in Montgomery County wants to maintain all existing storm drainage systems in its boundaries, the municipality may notify the County Council before the date on which the County Council adopts its annual budget and appropriations resolution.
- (ii) In that event, all assessable properties in the boundaries of the municipality shall be exempt from the levy made by the County Council for the future maintenance of its storm drainage.
