SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 65 - Militia

6.

- (a) (1) The Adjutant General may organize a uniformed honor guard from the National Guard or the organized militia to attend the burial service of a deceased veteran if:
- (i) The commander of an accredited veterans' organization or a friend or relative of the deceased veteran requests an honor guard to attend the burial service;
- (ii) A uniformed honor guard from the active armed forces or veterans' organization is not available; and
- (iii) The Adjutant General determines that provision of an honor guard will not have a detrimental effect on the readiness of the National Guard in the event of a State or federal emergency or the employment of a National Guard member.
- (2) If an honor guard from the active armed forces is not available, the Adjutant General may request an honor guard from a veterans' organization to attend the burial service of a deceased veteran.
- (b) Reasonable compensation of honor guard members shall be set by the Adjutant General, but not to exceed THE GREATER OF:
- (1) 75% of 1 day's basic pay, plus other expenses incurred to participate in the burial service of a deceased veteran; OR
