- (12)] Make recommendations to the Board of Public Works concerning appropriate aesthetic decorations, embellishments, accessories or ornamentation to State projects, buildings and property.
- (B) THE COUNCIL SHALL PUBLISH AN ANNUAL REPORT AND MAY PUBLISH OTHER MATERIAL AS IT DEEMS APPROPRIATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2000.

CHAPTER 135

(House Bill 523)

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City - Pen Lucy Community Center Loan of 1998

FOR the purpose of amending Chapter 317 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1998 to change the location of the project to a certain location in Baltimore City and to extend the time by which the Govans Economic Management Senate (GEMS) must provide and expend a matching fund; and generally relating to Chapter 317 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1998.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Chapter 317 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1998 Section 1

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Chapter 317 of the Acts of 1998

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

- (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Baltimore City Pen Lucy Community Center Loan of 1998 in a total principal amount equal to the lesser of (i) \$100,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
- (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
