CHAPTER 105

(Senate Bill 206)

AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - Student Financial Assistance - Maryland Teacher Scholarship

FOR the purpose of expanding the eligibility ~~and renewal~~ *renewability* requirements for the Maryland Teacher Scholarship to certain part-time students who are pursuing a graduate degree in teaching; and generally relating to the Maryland Teacher Scholarship program.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education

18-2203.

(a) The Administration shall annually select eligible students and offer a scholarship to each student selected to be used at an eligible institution of their choice.

(b) A recipient of the Maryland Teacher Scholarship shall:

(1) Be a Maryland resident;

(2) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, be accepted for admission [as a full-time student or be] OR currently enrolled at an eligible institution as a full-time UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT OR A FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME GRADUATE student pursuing a course of study or program in an academic discipline leading to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate;

(3) (i) For a student currently enrolled in high school, have earned a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent in core curriculum courses at the time of application; or
