(Senate Bill 11)

AN ACT concerning

Trader's Licenses - Exception for Exhibitors at Antique, Coin, or Collector Shows

FOR the purpose of establishing an exception from the trader's license requirement for certain exhibitors at antique, coin, or collector shows under certain circumstances; and generally relating to trader's licenses.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Business Regulation

17-1804.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, a person must have a trader's license whenever the person:

- (1) does business as a trader in the State; or
- (2) does business as an exhibitor in the State.
