AN ACT concerning

Family Law - Unregistered Family Day Care Provider - Civil Penalties

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Child Care Administration to issue a civil citation imposing civil penalties on an unregistered family day care provider; altering penalties for unregistered family day care providers; providing procedures for an appeal of a civil citation imposed under this Act; and generally relating to unregistered family day care providers and civil penalties.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Family Law

5-552.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a family day care home may not operate unless it is registered.
- (b) A family day care home is not required to be registered if the day care provider:
 - (1) is related to each child by blood or marriage;
- (2) is a friend of each child's parents or legal guardian and the care is provided on an occasional basis; or
- (3) has received the care of the child from a child placement agency licensed by the Administration or by a local department.
- (c) A person may not advertise a family day care home or family day care service unless the family day care home is registered under the provisions of this Part V of this subtitle.
- (D) AN EMPLOYEE OF THE ADMINISTRATION CHARGED WITH THE INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF CHILD CARE REGULATIONS OR THE CHIEF LICENSING AGENT IN A REGIONAL OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATION MAY SERVE A CIVIL CITATION TO A PERSON FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.
